

Phases Overview

1. Inspection

2. Qualification

- a. Part1
 - Vehicle can drive through the track
 - Remote emergency brake works
- b. Part 2
 - Time Trials
 - Fastest lap
 - Number of laps in 5 minutes

3. Head-to-head

- a. Pre-Check
 - Time trials
 - Bumper
 - Obstacle avoidance
- b. Race
 - Standing Start
 - Finish 10 laps before the opponent

Phase 1: Car inspection

- The car should be built according to FITENTH instructions.
- We will:
 - Check the hardware of the car to meet the requirements:

http://korea-race.fltenth.org/rules.html

• Check that the vehicle is safe



Phase 2: Qualification – Part 1

- 1. Same track as the race
- 2. Each vehicle must demonstrate that it can drive autonomously through a track without crashing.
- 3. The team must demonstrate that it is possible to trigger car emergency stop remotely.




Phase 2: Qualification – Time Trials

- Two heats, each 5 minutes
- Two goals (two leaderboards):
 - Fastest lap time
 - Highest number of completed laps
- Algorithm reconfiguration/tuning
 - Between the heats
 - During the heat, but the car must be stopped.
- Crash \Rightarrow go back to a checkpoint




Example : Time Trial





Phase 3: Head-to-head – Precheck





- Car completed time trials
- Car has a foam bumper
- Car must be perceivable by LiDAR
- Car can avoid obstacle static and dynamic obstacles






Phase 3: Head-to-Head Race

- Two cars on the track
- All-play-all or knockout tournament
- Finish 10 laps
- Two start lines
- Crashing
 - \circ Track border \Rightarrow fix the track and start from the point of the crash
 - \circ Opponent \Rightarrow allowed once, then disqualification
 - Time (2 mins) to reconfigure/tune the algorithm for both teams
 - Both cars continue from the same line
